Museum Sign

The museum has received a preliminary design for its new outdoor sign. As you may recall, the museum received a grant through Lancaster County for the addition of a new, outdoor sign. After consulting with Lincoln Neon Sign Company, the design team there came up with the following rendition.



Since the museum shares a building with USA Roller Sports, their name is also included on the sign. The sign will either be double sided or triple sided. These final details will go to the Museum Board for approval. More details will appear in following issues.

Skater Profile: Billy YaleChampion Speed Skater of New England

Billy Yale began speed skating on roller skates in 1911. Originally from his hometown of New, Haven Connecticut, Yale competed all over the northeast. This promising skater of his time only skated one year in the amateur ranks. After finishing that season with an undefeated record, promoters were after him hard to join

to professional ranks since Yale won all his matches with ease.

In 1913, Yale set an unofficial world record. With partner Harry Burke, the tandem skated a record 385 miles in a twenty-four hour period. This was done in relays of twelve hours over for two nights in Honesdale, Pennsylvania.


By March of 1915, Yale increased his competition by skating in the advertised World Championships.

Located in Washington, DC, these unsanctioned races hosted the nation's best. Yale finished 2nd in the ten mile race, completing the distance in thirty-one minutes. He also placed 3rd in the 100 mile race.

Skate of the Week:





Inventors F.C. Ireland and W.A. Leggo patented their skate in May of 1877. Different from the previous skates, this one has clamps to attach the skater's shoe instead of leather straps.

To keep the wheels parallel, there is a pair of springs at both ends that lie along the axles. Its springs press on the axel, which shifts the direction of the wheels and gives the capabilities to turn corners when the skater leans from side to side. There is also a turning screw under the plate that adjusts the clamps so the skate can fit the size and shape of boot worn by the skater.


The re-polished, wooden wheels gives the skate a nicely, finished look.

The History of Roller Skating

This book tells the full story of roller skating, from inception to present day. Written by a founding member of the museum James Turner, *The History of Roller Skating* explains all aspects of skating, from types of competitions to the skates themselves.

Each chapter contains a major area in skating. The book begins with early skating, its pioneers, and the early skates themselves. It then moves onto increased participation in the sport after 1863 and skating organizations. Disciplines of skating are described at length, in addition to schools, skating shows, costumes, and music. More than 150 photos help capture these ideas. For an all encompassing look at the industry of roller skating, this is the book for you!
