As you know, the museum is in the process of adding more display cases to the museum gallery. This projected six month project continues to go as planned.

The museum submitted its formal proposal to the Lancaster County Visitor's Improvement fund this week. This committee desides in December which groups receive funding.

Cockatoo skates



The museum collection contains all sorts of unusual skates. From off-road to gasoline powered skates, visitors love seeing the interesting collection of skates at the museum.

This particular pair of skates was made for a cockatoo. The small bird moves its legs forward and backward to great enough momentum to propel forward. These brass skates were built in the 1960s.

The museum has other skates and photos of animals wearing roller skates. On display are skates for a horse and a bear. In our archives we have photographs of dogs, chimpanzees, cows, and even an elephant using roller skates.

- First clamp-on skate patented by Everett Barney in 1864.


Rink Photo: Winter Garden

Skater Profile: Rollie Birkhimer Ohio skater/rink manager



Rollie Birkhimer was a great speed skater during his time. As a professional he won third place in the World Championship races in Detroit, MI on March 24, 1914, He also finished second in the International Professional Championships at Charleston, West Virginia in 1916.

Birkhimer exanded his roll in roller skating by managing a few rinks. In addition to summer rinks, Rollie managed the Coliseum Rink in Kansas City, Missouri for 1915. For those wishing to renew their memberships, we included the following form. Thanks in advance!

Rink Sticker Collection


